CPR and Defibrillator Training Update

Dear Readers,

At last! Good news!! Our village defibrillators are on their way!!! I appreciate that you have not heard much from me in the way of updates but I have to say it has been a bit of a task to secure training dates for the two venues. Nevertheless, we are finally there, and better late than never I say! The Welsh Hearts Charity who supply the machines, hold training sessions and provide regular maintenance of them, are attending Ysgol Derwenfa Primary School on Wednesday 8th November 2017 and Leeswood Community Centre on Saturday 18th November 2017.

The training session at the school will be private and will be solely for the pupils and the staff. I do know that the Coordinator for this area (Mr Nick Aitken) will be talking to the children in the afternoon and then there will be a further session for all staff.

The Community Centre training session however is a public event. It is essential that the public who use the Centre use this opportunity to undertake basic CPR training on offer and how to use the defibrillator machine (should it ever be needed). After all, like I have said previously, what is the point of having these machines if you don't even know how to turn them on! Don't be frightened by technology. So long as you know how to turn it on, the machine tells you the rest as you go along. But, to see for yourself, you really should do your best to attend.

The session at the Community Centre commences at 4.00pm. If there is major interest and a large number attend then the Charity will most certainly look at putting on a further session at a later date.

I have placed a poster in this edition and there will be further adverts up and around in different places, and indeed my lovely colleagues from the Carnival Committee are leaflet-dropping pretty much the whole village at the same time as their AGM posters go out. Lucky for me eh! Feel free though to mention it to your friends or neighbours just in case they are not fortunate enough to have had a leaflet through their door as I would hate for someone to say they didn't know about it and would have loved to attend.

The training session is free. However, the Charity have indicated that if people wish to undertake the training and have a certificate to prove so then there will be a small cost of £5.00. Well worth it I say. And well worth it for anyone who wishes to add to their C.V. that they are CPR and defibrillator trained.

If you wish to attend, but more importantly wish obtain a certificate, then please text me on 07787 856056 to secure your place at the session on the 18th or message me via social media's Facebook page (search for me under the name Louise Hoyle Fennell). It simply gives me, the Charity, and the Centre Committee a rough idea of the interest and how many to seat on the day. Plus I believe that there may be refreshments available afterwards so it's worth attending to then be able to sit and have a chat with people you may not have seen for a while.

As I mentioned in a previous write-up, 12 young people die suddenly from an undiagnosed heart condition each week in the UK and there is just a 3% survival rate out of 8,000 sudden cardiac arrests that occur beyond hospitals in Wales alone. Only weeks after my fundraising, someone sent me a link on the internet to a story of a 10 year old girl in Ireland who died on the playground from an undiagnosed heart condition. And now, well, everyone there is rallying around fundraising for a defibrillator - that little machine that could very well have increased her chances of survival or indeed have saved her life.

Like I also said in that previous write-up, the Community Centre is used frequently for various clubs and activities, meetings, bingos and discos, not to mention "funeral gatherings", so it is a matter for yourselves to consider whether or not you feel it is important enough to want to attend.

Remember, the Centre has already seen its fair share of sorrow and it is for those two gentlemen who suffered, and their families, which is why I have done this.

I do hope you can consider **not** sitting at home with that mind-set that it doesn't matter and that you don't need to go and that somebody else will know how to use it as, like I also said previously, what if you were the person lying on the floor needing that life-saving assistance, your life slipping away? Would you be wishing people had attended the training session then in order to save you?

Am I getting through? That ambulance sadly never did!

Are you Caught up in the Child Benefit trap?

Memories of an oilfield man

To leave Egypt or not?

By now we had settled fairly well in Cairo and slowly getting used to the Egyptian culture and their way of life, but I suppose things were different for me, coming off the rig it was like a holiday.

After working an 84 hour week, for a month I was ready to relax and enjoy my two weeks off with the family. I don't suppose I gave a great deal of thought about how Carol and the boys were adapting to this way of life. When I think back Carol's life must have been quite hectic ensuring the boy's left for school and arrived home on time, although we employed a cleaner, Carol would wait until she had gone home then she would get the vac out and start again. Due to the heat and humidity we would have to change our clothing twice or sometimes three times a day, although the washing machine in this apartment was old, it still managed the job. Some-days she would visit or go shopping with the other expat wives and have a walk around the local markets or into the City, and for anybody interested in golf there was a half decent golf course,

Mentioning the golf course reminds me of: Jack Feller, he was an American rig manager from another rig, sometimes myself and a couple of working mates would go to the golf course with a crate of beer and follow Jack around if only to watch his antics, he lost more golf balls not to mention his golf clubs! In fits of rage he would fling whatever club he was using into a tree or sand dune then storm off in a right paddy - the next day an Egyptian boy would be trying to sell his club or balls back to him,

With Christmas approaching and very little choice of shopping stores it was decided that a couple of wives would take a flight to Athens in Greece with a shopping list of presents suitable for the children of employees that were living in Cairo. All expenses, flights and gifts and a night in a hotel for the night, were paid for by the company,

The company arranged for an evening of entertainment in the Hilton hotel for the adults, the tables were laden with all branded label bottles of spirits the rule was if the bottle still had a cork or top on they were to be left on the table, but if they had been opened we could take them home,

I must say that the company IDC looked after us extremely well while we were on contract, we were allowed a certain amount of freedom, making allowances for the normal rough hard working behaviour of oilfield workers, but there were limits to behaviour that the company allowed and if you were fired from your job the company was legally bound to return you and your family back to your place of origin home) with one exception that if you quit the job yourself you would be liable for all expenses, flights, shipment etc.

That could be very costly, and it happened quite often, but the incentive to complete our two year contract was a lucrative bonus, Christmas had been and gone although it was business as usual on my rig 22, Barge Zarah, moving the rig and the barge to new locations laying out the eight anchors, spudding into the sea bed, drilling and if we were lucky strike oil and then bring in the well and burn off (flare).

During one working hitch (time on the rig) an incident occurred that I remember making me a little ashamed of being British: there was one of our mechanics who had his watch taken from his bedside table while he was on the deck. This very unusual because this was the first time anything had been stolen (or missing) in the eighteen months I had worked on this rig. The mechanic owned two watches one for his dress watch and one for working. Normally we left our valuables back on shore for security reasons. I think he forgot to leave his Rolex at home, anyway it went missing. The first person to be suspected was the Egyptian steward who cleaned and changed the beds out, he denied this and I for one believed him as I had known him from day one on the rig. On a rig or anywhere for that matter is a serious offence and it makes all the crew suspects. Anyway an Helicopter with the Egyptian police landed on the Helideck and as there was only one suspect (the steward) the two policeman took this poor man into an empty cabin and commenced to beat the hell out of him with their truncheons. I really wanted to interfere but was seriously warned not to. These police men then told my boss that the steward had admitted taking the watch but did not know where he had put it; his cabin was stripped as well as his body, still no watch was found, a stretcher was called for the steward to be carried onto the helicopter for further investigation,

It was a week later when the truth came out, Mohammed asked if he could speak with me as I had a good working relationship with all of my crew and he could speak good English, "what's the problem" I asked, "We do not think the steward took Mr Willies watch" he told me, "and why do you think that" he looked very embarrassed when he replied, "Mr Dave the assistant driller came out of Mr Willies cabin then his watch went missing" This Dave the assistant driller had only arrived on the rig the previous week, he had been transferred from our Bahrain division, "Are you sure about this Mohammed because this is a very serious accusation who witnessed this"

"Two roustabouts where talking in the alley way when they saw him come out of the cabin" he replied. I asked "will they repeat this to Luke (our rig boss)" he told me they would be willing to, I was still a little doubtful because some of the locals tend to tell porkies, any I asked him to fetch them to the office in five minutes then I went to Luke's office.

"This is one hell of a situation, if it's true that poor steward got the hell beaten out of him for nothing, tell the assistant driller to come down off the rig floor and come to my office then bring those two guys in with Mohammed to translate

and while there in the office, I need you and a witness to make a serious search of his cabin I will also ask him for the keys to his locker"

I asked Jimmy King, the off-duty driller to accompany me in the search. I won't go into all the detail, but we did find the stolen watch in his locker, the result was that he was immediately fired

with the detailed reason on his record this would be available to any future employers, in my opinion he got off far too lightly. We later found out the reason for his transfer from Bahrain was theft and they found it easier for them to send him to us and save that division the hassle.

The rig manager asked Salah from the office to inform the police of the situation, but I never found the outcome of it.

Apologies if I drift from one story to another but these little memories keep coming back to me. I tend to write them as they come to me. I do remember we had more thefts in the North Sea than I ever recall while working abroad, I will relate to these in later issues,

Our time living in Egypt was coming to an end, not because I didn't like it but we had to think of the boy's education and I did not want to move back to the UK so we looked into the possibility of moving to Cyprus which I will mention in the next issue, below are a few photo's (boring I know:-)



We did not know how the company would react to the possibility of us moving to Cyprus as we were supposed to live in the division(Egypt) and the invasion of Cyprus had recently ended, but more about that later. There are still a number of incidents that I was involved in during drilling for GUPCO (Egypt) in the Gulf of Suez, between Israel gun boats and us..

Technical Corner

Joseph Caruana

The environment is one of the most important issues that are being talked about at the present time. The subject touches a comprehensive range of aspects some of which affect us in our daily life, and influence the way we live. We see many initiatives that are taken in order to help preserve the environment and make the general public more aware of individual responsibility towards achieving a sustainable system. Sustainable energy has been with us for some good few years and it is being implemented at a good rate of continuous development. However, one should distinguish between sustainable energy and sustainable systems. Everybody knows that the two most common forms of sustainable energy are solar energy and wind energy. Nevertheless, although both solar energy and wind energy produces energy from natural sources without having to put energy input like oil or gas, they do require maintenance and therefore the energy generated is not totally free. This takes us to the next scenario as to what percentage of renewability is the system which is applied to manage the transformation of energy from one form into another. By looking at the broader picture as a renewable system rather than just a renewable source of energy, one might be in a better position to understand how renewable the whole application is. It could also inspire us to apply renewable systems not just to sources of energy, but to other applications as well.

When a system is self sustaining, it could be classed as a renewable system, nevertheless, the percentage of renewability should be noted in order to determine how renewably efficient the system is. To this end, let us consider

It is commonly known that solar panels convert sun light into electricity, and therefore they generate the largest amount of energy when they are directly facing the sun. As the sun travels from east to west, and most solar panels are set to face south, then the only time the system is running at maximum efficiency is at midday when the sun is in direct alignment with the solar panels. This system is therefore not as efficient as it could be, and improvements could be implemented. One such improvement would be to mount the solar panels in a way that they can follow the sun along its path from east to west like a sun flower. In order to achieve this, one would need to introduce a sun tracking system. A sun tracking system involves an electronic arrangement which acts as the brain of the system to track the sun, an electrical mover which will be in the form of a motor or actuator, and an arrangement of gearing of linkages to transmit the movement from the motor or actuator to the solar panels.

From studies which has been carried out, it has been estimated that by arranging the solar panels to follow the sun, one can increase the efficiency by over fifty per cent. This clearly shows that former renewable system is less efficient then the latter system, and there it might be more practical to refer to renewable energy as a renewable energy system rather than as renewable energy items on their own, such as solar panel. When one consider that the sun flower has been tracking the sun for hundreds of years, one might appreciate how advanced nature can be, and if we observe nature we might learn how to develop things that works with nature and achieve optimum efficiency. It might also be beneficial to understand the might of nature, and harness it in our favour in a friendly manner.


Lucan got up bravely and said, "I will fight for Leeswood."





DECLARATION OF INTEREST – MEMBERS CODE OF CONDUCT

There were no declarations of interest.

AGE FRIENDLY COMMUNITIES

The new Project Co-Ordinator, Ms Shereen Devine was in attendance. Ms Devine advised that her post is for 21 hours per week. She had met with the Clerk two weeks ago to discuss the Community groups and their contacts. Although Lynze Rogers had met with some of the groups, Ms Devine intended to meet with them to introduce herself. It had been quite helpful for Ms Devine to have the month of August to 'acclimatise' herself to the role and go through the information that had been collated by Lynze Rogers. The Playscheme was in operation on the School field for the summer holidays and Councillor R. Hughes offered to accompany Ms Devine to meet with the children and Playleaders. Councillor R. Hughes would also accompany Ms Devine to the Youth Club and Ysgol Derwenfa once they had re-opened in September. These were received from Councillors J. Atkinson and J. Caruana, Chairman.

DECLARATION OF INTEREST – MEMBERS CODE OF CONDUCT

There were no declarations of interest.

POLICE LIAISON

Councillor D. Rule, Vice-Chairman welcomed PCSO 3684 Peter Jones to the meeting. He is the new PSCO for the community of Leeswood and Pontblyddyn. The other communities within his responsibility are Treuddyn, Llanfynydd, Cymau, Ffrith, Abermorddu, Caergwrle, Hope and Higher Kinnerton.

PCSO Jones presented a report on the crime issues in the Community from 5th July to 5th September 2017.

Public Order Incidences

County Road, Leeswood – fighting and shouting in the street. Ffordd Celyn, Leeswood – damage to a trampoline.

Anti-Social Behaviour Incidences

08/07/2017 – County Road, Leeswood – house party.

09/07/2017 – County Road, Leeswood – unknown if this incident relates to the same property as 08/07/2017.

28/07/2017 – Ffordd Celyn, Leeswood – youths throwing stones

07/08/2017 – Heol-y-Goron, Leeswood – youths shouting abuse.

19/08/2017 – Grounds of Ysgol Derwenfa, Leeswood – a number of youths on the school grounds.

21/08/2017 – eggs thrown at a property.

PCSO Jones advised that he would be providing information on how the issues were dealt with. It had been noted that there was a significant amount of anti-social behaviour involving children. PCSO Jones stated that there had been a multi-services meeting, this included Social Services and the Housing Department at Flintshire County Council.

Observation was made that the previous PCSO, Andrea Ellis had advised that she would be conducting speed checks in the problem areas of the Community, it would be appreciated when possible if PCSO Jones could do this. It was pointed out that there are issues with vehicles parking part on and part off the pavement through the Community. Councillor R. Hughes informed that he was still waiting to meet with Mr Aled Davies, the Cemetery sub-contractor. Comment was made that the Cemetery was being kept in very good condition and looked well. All Councillors agreed that Mr Davies and his team were doing a good job.

The Clerk reported that she had still not received an invoice for the work on the Cemetery gates.

PLANNING APPLICATIONS

Planning Application – 057343 Demolition of the existing cement storage and loading facilities and the erection of a new Vertical Roller Mill (VRM), rail loading facility and modification to and extension of the existing railway line, together with ancillary development. AGE FRIENDLY COMMUNITIES

Councillor G. Sherwood reported that he had spoken with Mrs Shereen Devine, the Age Friendly Project Co-Ordinator earlier. The analysis of the questionnaire was in progress and the key points would be drawn out to form an action plan.

FORMATION OF A VILLAGE PLAN

All Councillors agreed that this item be postponed for discussion following the iBeacon meeting on Tuesday 12th September 2017.

COMMUNITY TRANSPORT

Councillor R. Hughes advised that it was hoped a twice weekly bus service from the communities of Leeswood, Treuddyn, Llanfynydd and Nercwys to Broughton and Chester would be established. The days of the proposed service was still under discussion, also the times the bus would travel.

HANSON HEIDELBERG CEMENT

The Clerk reported that Councillor J. Caruana, Chairman, had informed that the next planned Liaison Group meeting had been postponed. This was partly due to the death of County Councillor Ron Hampson and partly because there was some outstanding consultation required in regard to the proposed development at the works.

PARKING ISSUES – BELL'S CORNER AND JUNCTION OF BRYN CLYD/KING STREET

Councillor R. Hughes advised that yellow lines on Bell's Corner had been put in the capital programme for 2018/2019. It was possible that the work could be done earlier if the Community Council were prepared to fund it themselves.

Councillor R. Hughes informed that he was waiting on a further report about the possibility of yellow lines on the junction of Bryn Clyd/King Street.

It was proposed by Councillor C.E. Jones JP and seconded by Councillor D.K. Crowther that the cost of the project on Bell's Corner be looked into and if there was a possibility of a Community Council/County Council match funding initiative.

FOOTPATH TO THE REAR OF 24 TO 42 HEOL-Y-GORON, LEESWOOD

The footpath inspector from Flintshire County Council had been out to the site. This footpath was to be cleared of obstruction. Work was to be also carried out on Jenny Parry's Lane.

CADWYN CLWYD - iBEACON PROJECT

COMMUNITY HEALTH COUNCIL – NEWS RELEASE

Members had been circulated with a Press Statement on behalf of the Board of Community Health Councils in Wales.

This statement advised that the Consultation Institute has expressed serious concerns about the proposal to abolish CHCs in Wales, particularly in relation to independence, credibility and the lack of meaningful public involvement in service change. They have warned of the dangers of repeating the English experience of abolishing CHCs; "Community Health Councils were abolished in England a decade ago. Now Wales is thinking of doing the same. In England, their demise led to a succession of failed initiatives. CHCs were replaced by Public and Patient Forums. They were then abandoned in favour of Local Involvement Networks (LINks), and we now have HealthWatch, with the jury still out on their effectiveness". An event to consider the issues raised by the White Paper is proposed. The CHC movement will be sending delegates to this and it is considered that the debate will be useful to form a response and counter-proposals to the White Paper.

Councillors agreed to accept this correspondence.

JOINT MEETING WITH THE STANDARDS COMMITTEE AND VISIT BY THE OMBUDSMAN

Councillors had been circulated with e-mail correspondence from Mandy Haslam, PA to Chief Officers (Governance) and (Planning & Environment), Flintshire County Council, reminding of the above meeting to be held on Monday 2nd October 2017. This was accepted.

ONE VOICE WALES – REFORM OF DATA PROTECTION LEGISLATION

Correspondence had been received from Paul R. Egan, Deputy Chief Executive and Resources Manager, One Voice Wales advising of the NALC legal briefing regarding the Reform of Data Protection Legislation. This provides important information on changes to the data protection legislation which Community Council's need to be aware of and plan accordingly. It is the intention of One Voice Wales to work with the Information Commissioner's Office to arrange a number of seminars throughout Wales on this topic. The details of these will be provided in due course.
