

#### **Technical Corner**

Sometimes we have to make a good study of what has been done over the years, what has been successfully achieve, and all the things that did not go according to plan, or did not achieve the desired effect.

When industry tries something new, the novelty creates positive feelings, and everybody wants to be part of the action, due to the hype created by the initial excitement some things might be overlooked. Overlooking part of a manufacturing process can prove very expensive, and corrective action can exert huge strain on the financial resources available to sustain a development project. In my time in Industry, I have witnessed many occasions where things have been overlooked, or corners were cut to achieve a quick fix. We need to differentiate between accidentally overlooking part of a project and cutting corners. Overlooking a section of a development project of a development project could be put down to an innocent error, and not as deliberate action. However, cutting corners is an action in which the executer deliberately deviated from the normal from the normal or proper process in order to save time or money. From my experience, when I observed occasions where corners were cut, the result was a weak final product. A weak final product can have a negative effect on the reputation of an organisation. Damaged reputations can take a long time to put right, and can also affect sales which will cause a ripple effect on the financial wellbeing of the whole organisation.


If we look at the history of the car industry and analyse how it went on over the years, we might come across several intervals where corners might have been cut or where quality might have suffered due to certain cutbacks. Cutting back on the substance of a product might create a weakness on the overall wellbeing of a final product, and although it might be initially attractive on the market due to a cheap price, there might be comebacks which could be costly to rectify. It is therefore imperative to draw an overall picture of all the aspects of the project in hand, look at it from all angles, do some lateral thinking to produce a comprehensive vision of how the end product needs to be to combat the elements on the market.

Engineers and Scientists are always coming up with new ideas, however, for some reason or another, these ideas are sometimes lost along the way. Whether they have been lost during their conceptual stage, their development period, or final production, is an issue open for debate. When Britain produced cars for all classes of society, everybody from all walks of life was seen proudly driving to work in a British car, me included.

This country has pioneered several innovative ideas, some of which have successfully reached the market place to create wealth, prosperity, and jobs. Other ideas were not followed through or were picked up again at a later stage.

The tilting train was pioneered in this country, and allot of money was poured into the project. It was an exciting project, it was futuristic, and placed us one or two steps ahead of international competition. This was a project that initially started very well, and allot of research and development was carried out. Several prototypes were developed and tested, then all of a sudden the work stopped. The reason why the work topped is not a clear cut issue, and several people have their personal opinion as to why this has happened. The project was restarted years later, but allot of time was lost, and others were catching up. Again, here we have an issue which we can analyse and from which we can learn. These issues must be studied carefully by the younger generation to create a solid manufacturing base that can deliver the goods that the market wants.





Over the years, we have started several industrial projects, but whether we have followed all of them to a profitable end is another matter. Nevertheless, we have proved time and time again that we have the capabilities to manufacture world class goods, affordable goods, and goods that we can all be proud off.

Manufacturing is an ongoing process which survives on continuous and incremental investment, engineering expertise, and marketing strength. We need to create a harmonious atmosphere where the financial sector and the industrial sectors work together, for the greater good of further industrial growth.

#### Memories of an oilfield man

#### **Moving to Cyprus**

Cyprus seemed an excellent choice as it had been under British administration since around 1914, and it was only an hour flight from Cyprus to Egypt, but there was only one snag, would the company allow me to commute as we were supposed to live in the division of Cairo. As stated previously Carol and a friend Margaret had travelled to Cyprus to check out schools etc, and they both came back totally in love with the place.

This was in 1976 and Turkey had successfully invaded Northern Cyprus with 5,000 casualties on both sides, if any person is interested in the invasion I highly recommend reading "The Cyprus Conspiracy" by Brendon O'Malley & Ian Craig, 2001, if this is still in print The American CIA have a lot to answer for it certainly opened my eyes: - anyway that is beside the point.

How could we get permission to transfer to Cyprus? We knew that Gordon and his family wanted to move there but we knew the company would not allow just the two of us to go, so there was only one thing to do. Let our wives sell the idea to the rest of the expat wives and let them convince their menfolk that the schooling and a quality way of life would be better for everyone. I must say they did not require much persuasion, so it was decided that we would arrange a meeting with the divisional manager Gus Henderson. I must say that Gus and I had a great relationship for some reason, possibly because I never sucked up to him like all the other guy's. Maybe the other reason was that I had arranged for Mohamed, my main man Friday, from the rig to come into Cairo with our crew of roustabouts during their field break and dig out a swimming pool for Gus and family, and anyone who wanted to pop in for a beer or two. There was another incident involving that pool/ Gus and myself, If I remember, I will put in another issue. The pool took many months of hard digging with Picks and shovels, but the crew were more than happy with the project and they were well paid (via the company even if they didn't know it),

Anyway, back to our own conspiracy; over a drink or two, we had decided for all the expats to approach the Boss with an ultimation either we would be allowed to move across to Cyprus or we would all resign. At that time there were plenty of jobs in the oil industry for experienced personal, the strange thing was not one of our American coworkers wanted anything to do with it they were too used to saying yes sir no sir. There were about four of us in the office and I was elected spokesman, I explained to him that the families were not happy living in the division and wanted to move to Cyprus for a better Quality of life for all, and that it was only an hour's flight from Cairo to Cyprus. Then went on to explain that there were Brits who commuted to the UK who did not live in the division, "How come none of my fellow Americans are here with you" he asked, "I don't know

Gus perhaps they and their families are happy living here". After a couple of beers and a little bit deep thinking he said "Tell you what we can do, I can see the problem, if the wives are unhappy that makes unhappy workers so I can see no problem with you guys moving over there but if any one of you miss a crew change flight you will all move back or find another job, ok?". Once out of the office we decided to have a few more beers to celebrate this included our American mates who all had sour faces, "you should have come in with us" I said to Jimmy King, "Didn't want to risk our jobs" was the reply, "Not to worry Jim, once we are settled there you and Pat can come and stay with us for a break".

What was the next step? Look for a place to live and arrange schooling for the boy's I suppose this would mean another trip to Cyprus for Carol while I was working on the rig, Carol and Margaret decided to go the following month.

#### This is Carols story:

(she is sitting here while I pick her brains) "We arrived in Larnica Airport with only hand luggage, in the 70s the airport consisted of a corrugated building not much bigger than a tin shed but security was very tight due to the Turkish invasion, and Nicosia was under Turkish control with united Nations armed forces on the border. We took a taxi into Limassol and checked into a hotel, and Margret proved to be a pain in the backside she was totally incapable of doing anything for herself and expected me to run around after her day and night. She clung to me like glue, but Gordon had helped us so much when we first arrived in Egypt I felt indebted to help her. After a month or two living near her, it drove me nuts, more about that later. So, the following day was spent looking for some where to live, I had heard of two apartments available one above the other as I was the spokesperson the landlord showed me around the top apartment first and it was just what we needed until a house could be found, I shook his hand paid the deposit and agreed to the terms. It was time to show the other apartment to Margaret while I had another look around, the next thing was that the landlord came back up the stairway and told me that my friend was crying, "what is wrong with you" I asked her, "you have the better flat and I wanted that one" she replied in between sobs, I could not believe it so I ended up letting her have the top one to keep the piece, and that was only one incident of many.

The next day was spent making enquiries about the school situation, with her holding onto my skirt, we met an English-speaking lady Anne Constatiniedes, who was married to a Greek Cypriot business man, we became good friends and remain in contact today. She told me of a private English school that her children attended, and she recommended it highly, and as the company was footing the schooling costs I thought it would suit us, we planned to meet the owners of school, a Mr &Mrs Foley. They had to leave Nicosia because of the war where they had a huge catamaran (this was a twin hulled boat that they lived on) and taught English/French and art, but they had to flee with their children and what they could carry in their car, leaving their home and business behind. They managed to rent a building and open another English school. Anyway, to cut a long story short our children were enrolled,

So that was all done and dusted now we could relax a little and explore Limassol our new home town for a couple of years, all I had to do was return to Egypt and sort out what we needed to take with us. Cyprus: - this would be a lot different to Egypt and we could buy items that we needed, and it was not such a culture change, but I think Tom would prefer to stay in Egypt as had gone native, so to speak,

That was Carols little memory:- she had a lot more to contend with, leaving the UK on her own then having to move to Cyprus on her own, all I had to do was fly to Cyprus where Carol would be waiting at the airport to pick me up and take me to our new home that she had sorted out, I couldn't have managed without her......

#### **Leeswood Allotments**

On the 17th of February the Potato Fair was held at the Daniel Owen Centre in Mold. It is an annual event and is a great opportunity to look through the vast number of potato varieties available. The photo shows just a few of the ones to choose from. They also sell fruit bushes, fruit trees and vegetable seeds at very reasonable prices.

Seed potatoes are available as First Early, Second Early and Main Crop varieties, the difference being the time between planting and harvesting. First earlies mature quicker and are usually ready in around 10 weeks, second earlies in about 13 weeks and maincrop in about 20 weeks.



Also on sale at the potato fair were asparagus crowns. I had tried to grow asparagus on the allotment a few years ago. I prepared the bed and erected a low windbreak on two sides as I'd read that they needed a sheltered spot and our allotments are quite open to the elements. I planted the crowns but nothing grew. Following other attempts I decided that I wouldn't try to fight against nature and just stick with vegetables that were happy in Leeswood soil. However, seeing a box of asparagus crowns in the potato fair, I have decided to give this tasty vegetable another go. The crowns themselves don't look as though they have much life in them as you can see in the picture but I'm crossing my fingers that in two years time (I'm told that's how long it takes), I will have a decent crop of asparagus to bring home.


I'll finish with two weather sayings about this month..."
