

#### "AFTER THE SERVICE" (A CHRISTINGLE STORY.)

Once upon a time there was a family who went to a Christingle service in Church. At the service the little girl received a Christingle, but by the time they got home she'd eaten all the sweets and only had the orange and the candle left. So, when they got into the house Mum took the orange into the lounge and put it, with its candle in a corner. Then they went into the kitchen to get tea ready.

Now in Church the little candle had felt very special. He'd heard the vicar say that he was like Jesus who was the light of the world. But as he looked round the lounge he started to feel very small and unimportant. The Family obviously liked candles and they had lots of them. There were big candles in lovely candle stands, candles in Jars, little candles in very nice candle stands, and even the little candles in individual pots were scented and the pots looked special, and here he was, suck in an orange and standing in a corner. He really didn't feel very special at all – he thought that all the other candles must be far more like Jesus than he was.

Well the evening wore on, the family ate tea, Dad went out, and Mum and the little girl sat in the lounge watching TV. Then – calamity – the TV, and the lights all suddenly went off. There'd been a power cut! Mum told the little girl to sit still while she felt her way into the kitchen to find a torch, then she came back into the room with a box of matches. "Tell you what" she said "lets light all the candles then we'll be able to see". So one by one she lit the candles, she lit the big ones in posh holders, and the ones in jars, and she even lit all the little ones in the posh stand, then the little girl said – "Oh, we must light my Christingle Candle too, that's special!" and so, that's what Mum did.

And, do you know, when the little Christingle candle looked around the room he realised that it didn't matter how posh a candle looked in the daylight, when it came to doing their job they all looked the same. They all had small flickery flames, and none of them would have been much good without the help of the others but together they lit the room so that Mum and the little girl felt safe until the electricity came back on.

In church we always say that people are special, that they are loved by God and carry a little bit of the light of Jesus inside them – but out in the world, in school, at home, in shops and in the street sometimes we don't feel very special. We feel as if there are so many other people bigger, cleverer, or better looking than us.

Jesus used his life to love and help others, to make people feel good about themselves, and that is what we are asked to do too. So, whenever we show someone kindness, or whenever we say something caring, or help others, we are using that little bit of Jesus light that is inside us. You don't have to be big, good looking, or very clever to do that.




Dear Friends,

- This is the message of Christmas.



## WALKING THE FOOTPATHS IN LEESWOOD

#### FLINTSHIRE'S ROUTE MAP

Flintshire has grouped all the footpaths designated as public rights of way. And each Community, such as Leeswood, has its own bundle of paths, identified by a number. So, for example, the footpath which begins at King Street, opposite the Community Centre and journeys down via fields to Pontblyddyn is **FOOTPATH 61.** Most walkers don't need to know the numbers of the footpaths in order to walk them, but they are useful when contacting the Community Council or the County Council if there is a problem. There are approximately 40 of these paths, some long, some short. One or two are subdivided. **FOOTPATH 61A**, for example starts at the same point as Footpath 61 but soon branches off and finds another way of reaching Pontblyddyn, via Blast Wood, crossing Dingle Road and reaching the main road at a point close to the former Queen Farm [between the Church and the Petrol Station]

Here is a description of a short footpath, FOOTPATH 61C from Blast Wood to Parc Derwen.

#### FOOTPATH 61C

This is a useful link footpath between Footpath 61 in Blast Wood and Parc Derwen in Leeswood.

**1.** The footpath begins at a point where Footpath 61 leaves Blast Wood as it progresses to Dingle Road.

There is a <u>waymark</u> by the side of the <u>gate here</u>, indicating where Footpath 61C branches off.

**2.** Continuing through woodland, the well-used path leaves Blast Wood where two posts suggest the remnants of a stile or gate.

#### Waymarks here, on both sides, would be helpful.

**3.** Footpath 61C then crosses open land, aiming for houses and a kissing gate. From here the footpath proceeds between properties to come out onto Ffordd Derw, where there is a <u>waymark on a pole.</u>

**4.** Crossing the road the footpath turns right and almost immediately left, into Llys Bedw, maintaining its westerly direction between houses. There is a tarmac path here which cuts through, passing the end of Maxwell Drive to find another alleyway before reaching the main road, Parc Derwen.

**WAYMARKS** These are round discs, in yellow and green, placed on posts and stiles with arrows indicating the direction to be followed. Usually this is STRAIGHT ON, but may be LEFT or RIGHT or even HALF LEFT, HALF RIGHT. They are particularly useful for walkers when a CHANGE OF DIRECTION is required, or where the way forward looks obscure.

**WAYMARK ON A POLE** Where a footpath leaves a main road, <u>the County is obliged to</u> <u>place a more substantial waymark on a pole</u>, indicating where this happens.

**GATES & STILES.** Where footpaths progress through hedges, into fields or any boundary, the County provides aids to help. The most obvious are **GATES**, usually these days new galvanised kissing gates. They save walkers from having to climb.



Unfortunately they do not usually allow the safe passage of wheelchairs or pushchairs, and by and large, disabled people are usually excluded from using footpaths.

**STILES** are the more traditional method of crossing into fields. A stile needs a step, or even two steps, and if these are missing the stile really becomes more of a barricade than an aid. There is one well-known stepless stile on Footpath 55, in a field corner close to Leeswood Green Farm.

The Council also provide **BRIDGES** where footpaths cross streams and rivers. There is a bridge over the River Alyn on the way to Coppa, and a bridge over the River Terrig close to the old Railway line. Some of these bridges have gates to prevent stock from wandering.

**HANDRAILS** are useful, not only on the bridges, but by the side of **STEPS**. A good example of the provision of steps with a handrail is on the way down from the A5104 on the footpath [61B] to the Cricket Club.

#### MAP SHOWING DESIGNATED FOOTPATHS IN LEESWOOD [WEST]

The map shown in this article gives you an idea of how the footpaths cross the Leeswood Community. I have given each footpath a different colour, where possible. You can see that Footpath 98 shows "The Horse Walk" a traditional footpath which links Leeswood Hall and one of its original farms Cae-du.

Other lines on the map show **CONTOURS** and **FIELD BOUNDARIES**.

**CONTOURS** are the lines with numbers on. A **CONTOUR** is a line on a map joining points of equal height [in this case FEET above sea level – the map is pre-metric].

**FIELD BOUNDARIES** can usually be distinguished from Contours as they are more "field-shaped". However, many fields have become larger in recent years, as hedges have been grubbed up to assist ploughing – so some of these field boundaries are inaccurate.

**FOOTPATHS** are shown as dotted lines – but these are the ones that are not public rights of way, so evidence of a footpath is not evidence of a right of way.

#### MIKE'S MOVEMENTS

It is as long ago as 1995 when I first started walking the footpaths in Leeswood, so it seems to be a good time to walk them all again [with time on my hands during lockdown]. I am in the processing of writing them all up and letting the Community Council and the County Council know what state the paths are in and where improvements are needed. I must say there have been significant improvements over the last 25 years. Gone are the days when with Trevor we had to plunge our way through a thick hedge, or try and unearth a dilapidated stile which was worse than useless. There remain one or two dire problems – the dangerous approach onto the main road by the Cemetery comes to mind, and waymarking is hit and miss in some areas, so that the paths can be hard to find. I'm a quarter of the way through now, and will keep you up to date in future articles.

#### TO CELYN FARM AND CAE DU Circular

#### Allow 1 hour

1. Leave the main road, Hall Hill, on the bend. There is a waymark on a pole here. Follow the "Horse Walk", as it's known. Just where the wood ends, on the left, there is a stile which takes you down into a field. There is a waymark here. One of the steps needs repair, so take care.

2. Keep the hedge close by on your left as you begin to circle the field. On the rise there is a stile in the hedgerow to your left, reached by a bridge over the stream. The stile is in good order and there is a waymark. Cross the stile into the large field.


3. You now have to cross this field with no real evidence of a footpath, as the land is regularly used for crops. Look across the field at the hedge and trees on the far side. Pick out a lone, relatively tall tree and head for it. With good luck you will reach a working gate at the far side with a waymark.

4. In the small field beyond the gate, keep to the right hand-side where there is a pool complete with wild life, on your right. As you progress round you will come to another tall stile, in good condition, also with a waymark. In the next field, usually with horses, aim to clip the field, making for a gateway with Celyn Farm in the background. You reach the edge of the field and a stile with a good waymark on a post, and find that the routes are numbered. So this was footpath 100! On the other side of the stile you find a road. Turn right.

5. Follow the road down for a short distance *[look out for sudden traffic]* as far as Celyn Cottages. Leave the road here by turning right and following a hedge-lined lane. This will continue to wind for some distance. You reach a point where a less well used lane goes off to the right. Take it.

6. After a short distance this lane turns sharply left and when you reach a kind of T-junction, go sharp left into a field and immediately right. Here you can cross over a well-managed stile with a waymark. This enables you to cross a short field, with the hedge to the right. At the far corner you will find a gate facing you which you need. There is no waymark here, by the way. Go through the gate and carry straight on

7. Continue in a straight line, with the hedge to your right. You come to a gate in the fence-line on your right. You need to engineer your way through this gate. There is a waymark on the far side here, for walkers coming in the opposite direction, but no waymark for us. It doesn't seem to be used often. You are now in a narrow field, with another field gate opposite. Keep the hedge to your right and reach the gate. This field gate is even more static than the previous one and needs much human effort to open. Go through the gate and you are in the last larger field.

Last December, Leeswood Community Centre (Registered Charity 1171794) took over running of the community centre from Flintshire County Council. This hasn't been an easy year – we were required to be closed from mid-March until late September and then again during the fire-break.

The coronavirus regulations have severely limited the type of activities that can take place in the centre – until very recently, even small meetings were not allowed, and we are still not able to hold larger events such as bingo or music nights. Many of our regular groups have paused their activities until things are a little safer. The Sunshine café is planning to reopen in the new year.

However, the centre is not entirely empty. Many of you may have visited us to receive your flu jab this autumn – the centre was able to offer a safe environment for Leeswood Surgery to provide this service to the community. We have two dance schools, DancingGemz and Streetdanz, running ballet and street dance for younger children on three afternoons, and Coleg Cambria are running a tablet course.

This has clearly had a negative impact on our finances, but we'd like to thank everyone in Leeswood who has supported us over this last year – particular mention should go to the Reindeer Lodge, the Carnival and the Sunshine Café who have given us generous donations which we will be spending on improving the centre.

We received £1296.15 recently thanks to Coop members choosing us as their cause of choice for the Local Community Fund, and we have been lucky enough to be chosen as one of the three local causes for this coming year. So, if you do shop at the Coop, become a member and choose Leeswood Community Centre as your cause of choice – for every £1 you spend on Coop brand goods until October 2021 we will get 2p.

**Resolve Your Resolutions!** 

"Physical exercise has some value, but spiritual exercise is valuable in every way, because it promises life both for the present and for the future." (GNB 1 Timothy 4:8 (NT))

There is just something about the start of a new year that always gives me the feeling of a "fresh start" and a "new beginning". A "clean sheet" and "wiping the slate". Fans of EastEnders will be very familiar

with some of these phrases! But in reality, there is no difference between December 31st and January 1st. Nothing mystical or magical happens at midnight on the last day of December. The Bible doesn't mention them as far as I am aware. But if a Christian wants to make a New Year resolution, should it be any different from anyone else's?

The usual New Year resolutions are to stop smoking, to stop drinking, to handle money more wisely, and to spend more time with family. By far, the most common New Year's resolution is to lose weight, combined with more exercising and eating more healthily. Don't get me wrong, these are all good aims for anybody. However, 1 Timothy 4:8 instructs us to keep fitness in perspective: *"For physical training is of some value, but godliness has value for all things, holding promise for both the present life and the life to come."* The vast majority of New Year resolutions, even among Church goers, are in relation to physical things. Perhaps this should not be. After all, exercise, fitness and hopefully the longer life and wellness are not things we take with us when we die and we leave our bodies behind. But neither should this be an excuse to not make the most of our physical 'side'. So, what about our spiritual 'side'? We ALL have a spiritual side even if we don't recognise it as such or refuse to acknowledge we have it.

Many people make resolutions to pray more often (e.g. even when times are good and not just during the bad times), to read the Bible more and to attend Church more often than Easter and Christmas, if that. These are fantastic aims. But these can fail just as often as the non-spiritual ones. This is especially true when they are our own ideas and driven by our own determination to succeed. Perhaps we need some help, from God maybe?

If God is at the centre of our New Year resolution, it has a greater chance of success, provided we too are committed to it. If God wants us to achieve something, He will help us. If a resolution is not God-honouring and/or is not in agreement with the Bible, we will probably be on our own.

But remember this folks: Our resolutions don't have to be kept on ice until the New Year. "New Year resolutions" can be made and started <u>at any time of year</u>. This may be obvious to many folk, but it's true and needs to be said. They are then known as *"seasonally adjusted New Year resolutions"* ... only joking!

#### **Technical Corner**

#### Joseph Caruana

When we drive along our roads on our daily journeys, whether it is to and from work or doing our weekly shopping, you might have observed the different makes of cars being driven along our roads. As I have been in manufacturing industry for most of my life, I get a bit concerned to see so many imported cars on our roads. I do not blame the owners for this situation because consumers will by whatever they feel they can afford. We hear business terminology such as parent company or sister company, but it gets confusing as to what kind of relationship really exists between such companies.

It could sometimes be possible that companies import manufactured goods, and when asked where these goods are manufactured, they say that they are manufactured by a sister company in another company. We also hear terminologies such as 'Designed in Britain'. Just by designing things over here and then give the bulk of the work to a company overseas, you will not be helping the manufacturing industry. Sometimes it gets confusing as to what kind of relationship exists between companies and how sisterly their relationship is. With this in mind, it might be wise to be more inquisitive and enquire the exact origins of the products you purchase, because although some products are being sold under a British brand they could be made anywhere in the world. If a product is made in another country, the money that you pay to purchase that product goes to that country. It is therefore important to make sure that you know where a product is made, and if there is a sister company involved, enquire about the relationship that exist between them because we need to start manufacturing more products over here in this country, to keep the wealth over here rather than sending it abroad.

These days we have a different kind of enemy, which could be referred to as a modern enemy, and you might ask the question as to who is a modern enemy. A modern enemy could be any other country who is competing against us on the world markets. Any other country that seeks superiority over us could be politely termed as a modern enemy. Nevertheless, we need to understand that these modern enemies are totally

#### different to those that we fought against in

numerous military campaigns. In contrast, gains and losses are determined by the influence that one country might have over the industrial capabilities of another country. This is because, if an investing company has its headquarters in another country, any decision made by that company is likely to favour the country where the headquarters are located. Over the last couple of decades we have lost control of a few companies to overseas control. This trend needs to be reversed, we need to start manufacturing more, at least what we consume ourselves and then for export markets. We have always been a leading manufacturing nation, a nation proud of what we make. It is our duty to maintain that tradition. We cannot rely on anybody else, we can only rely on our manufacturing capabilities and our endeavour to succeed, with a good measure of indefatigability equal to that which our mothers and fathers shown in the past. We are now fighting to establish a stronger manufacturing base which will utilise the resources that we have. Human resources we have in abundance and our intellectual capabilities are second to none. Combine this with good measure of coordinating all the ingredients together, I am sure that we will come up with a successful formula.

Another aspect or ingredient that plays an important part in the success of a manufacturing company, is continuous and incremental innovation. Innovation is not only applied to the products the company manufacture, but also to the manufacturing procedures, how thina are processed within the office structure and SO on .Progress and success is the product of everybody pulling in the same direction. There should be no us and them, everybody should work as a positive collective unit. However, such a system requires a lot of trust in one-an-other, and there should be no abuse of the system. If the system is abused, it would badly backfires and will cause things to malfunction causing everything to go haywire. If you have all the ingredients to manufacture goods and you decide not to, is a waste of resources. There are those of us that would take the initiative and make things work, while there are others who would take the easy way out or they could not be bothered. It is up to each individual to decide what he or she wants to do. Nevertheless, everybody is expected to do their duty, be industrious, help others, and use talents to improve whatever we can.
